

With construction well under way there are two (2) major phases that are about to occur in the months ahead.

Phase 1, MARCH 3rd Closure – Knoxville Avenue:

The first major event is closing Knoxville Avenue and the BC Monumental Staircase beginning March 3rd. This area will reopen, pending any unforeseen events, April 6th. This closure is necessary for the electrical installation of the UC Building. This closure will involve redirecting both HSC community parking and foot traffic for faculty, staff, student and patients. 1. Starting the week of February 19th, the construction contractor will begin setting up fencing on Knoxville Avenue east of the Academic Classroom Building in preparation for closure. No traffic or pedestrians will be affected during this preparation.
2. On March 3rd, Knoxville will be closed to all vehicular traffic attempting to gain access to the area under the overhang at the main entry.
3. The BC Monumental Staircase will be closed off to all pedestrian traffic. The Pickup and Drop-off Location associated with Citibus will be relocated along 5th street.
4. Pedestrian traffic using the sidewalk leading up to the BC Core will still have use of the sidewalk; however, pedestrians will follow a boarded pathway along the fencing up to the first floor West BC Core entrance. [Please see “Knoxville Pedestrian Foot Traffic”](#).
5. The ADA accessible pedestrian route to our facilities will route through the Academic Classroom Building. Signage will be placed throughout the campus and along 5th Street to support these modifications.
6. New ADA Parking locations:
 - a. During Phase 1, ADA parking locations are being relocated to address these construction changes.
 - b. On or about March 3rd, ADA accessible spaces within the D1 parking lot will be relocated to the B2 parking lot located North of the Physicians Medical Pavilion. [Please see “ADA Parking B2” map](#).
 - c. [Please see “D1-D2 Parking Lot Traffic” map](#). Vehicular traffic will be rerouted at Knoxville and the D1 and D2 lots will be available for use, as necessary, for **Faculty and Staff** only, until such time it is turned over to the Contractor for the future “Classroom/Academic Event Center”. See Phase 2 details below, June 1st closure for more information.
7. Temporary Parking Lot Closure for permanent upgrades:
 - a. The F-0 temporary parking lot will be closed beginning March 3rd to renovate the parking spaces. It will reopen, pending any unforeseen events, between June 1st and June 30th. During this time, employees should park in their assigned parking lot, one of

the student lots, or they may park in the Z-1 overflow lot on the east side of the Physicians Medical Pavilion building.

Phase 2, JUNE 1st Closure – Parking Lots C3, D1, and D2:

The second major event will occur June 1st. This will involve the closing of the following parking lots until all new facility construction has been completed, **tentatively planned for the Spring of 2019**, in order to begin the construction of the Classroom/Academic Event Center and the new 5th Street entrance: [Please see “D1-C3 Lot Construction Capture” map.](#)

1. Permanent closure of C3 – for preparation and the construction of the “Grand Entrance” from 4th Street.
2. Permanent closure of D1 and D2 – for preparation and the construction of the “Classroom/Academic Event Center”.
3. Partial closure of D3 temporarily, minimum of 3 weeks, no longer than 6 weeks.
4. Temporarily closing access to the B3 Patient Parking for a maximum of 3 weeks, pending any unforeseen delays; access to the lot will be reopened from 5th Street after the modifications are complete at the South West corner of B3. During this time, Patient Parking will temporarily move to A1, A2 or A3 as necessary, and employees should park in the Z-1 overflow lot on the east side of the Physicians Medical Pavilion building.
5. Reopening of the F-0 Lot.
