- Full Accreditation Standing:**

The Doctor of Pharmacy Program of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Pharmacy is fully accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) through June 30, 2020. ACPE accreditation is public recognition that a professional degree program leading to the Doctor of Pharmacy degree is judged to meet established qualifications and education standards through initial and subsequent periodic evaluations. 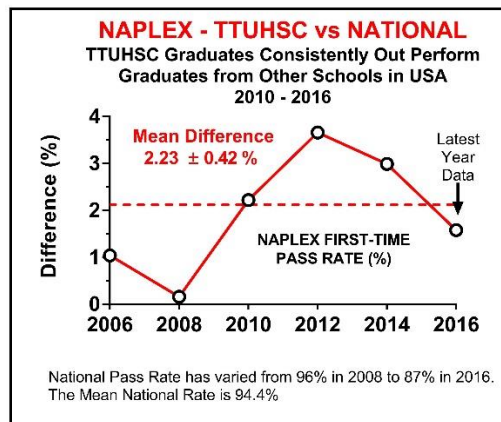
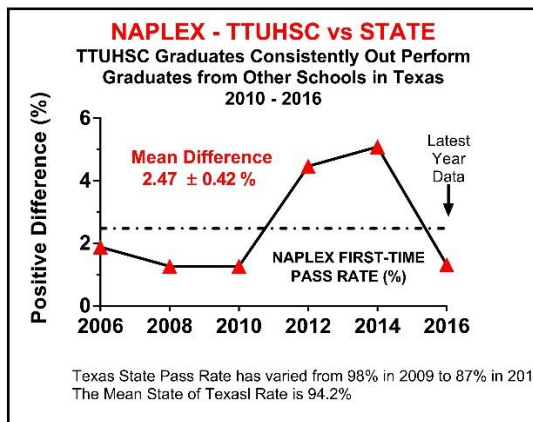
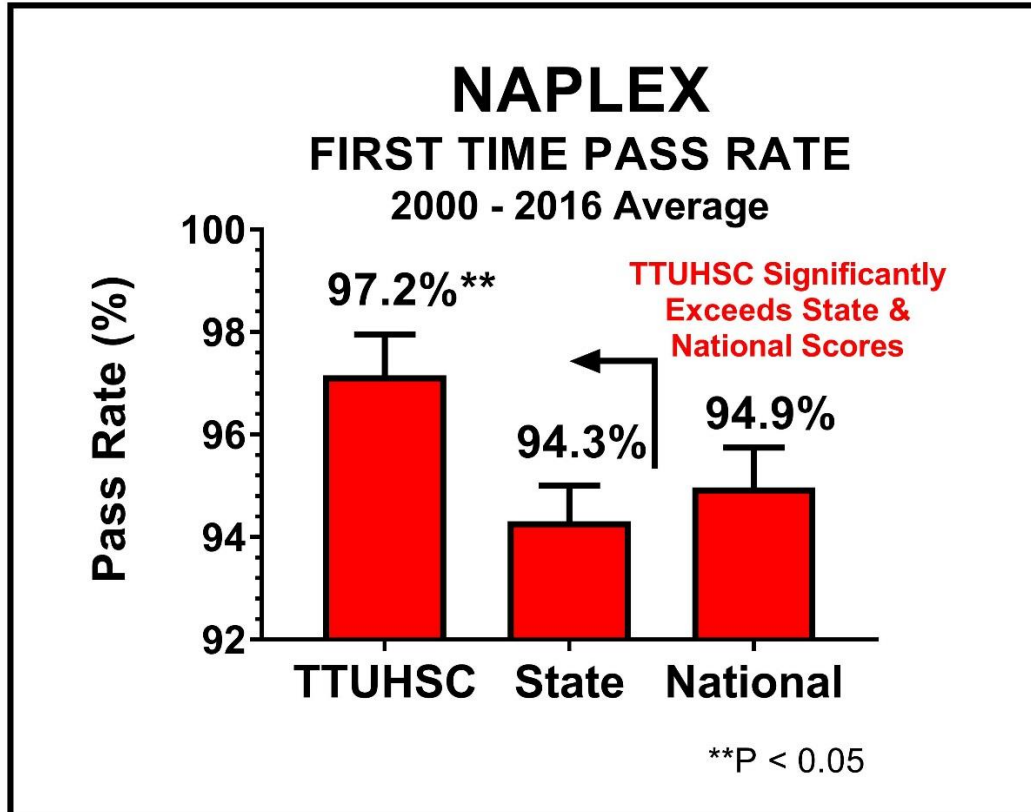
